It is a regional collaboration of both public and private sectors and has been highly successful. The initial phase of AZTech cleared the path for this next phase by removing institutional barriers, building collaborative relationships and garnering resources to ensure its effectiveness. The AZTech TMC Operators Working Group is a coordinating group of traffic management center operators to improve the working relationships among local traffic Management Centers (TMC) in Maricopa County.

Purpose of the TMC Operators Working Group (core question & deliverables)	Reason the TMC Operators Working Group exists	The AZTech TMC Operators Working Group exists to improve the working relationship among local traffic management and operations centers, ADOT Traffic Operations Center and public dispatch centers in Maricopa County by taking tours of each facility, obtaining a better understanding of the capabilities of each center, and becoming familiar with the procedures, equipment capabilities, locations and hours of operation of each center to enhance traffic management regionally.

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Authority, Accountability	Identifies what decisions the team can make and to whom they are accountable	The membership of the AZTech Executive Committee gives authority to AZTech through commitment of its resources and alignment of initiatives, policy and procedural implementation. The TMC Operators Working Group will make decisions using a consensus model regarding the direction and focus of the Working Group. The Working Group chairs will be empowered to make a decision if the group needs to move forward and cannot agree. The Working Group will also work closely with the AZTech Operations Committee in order to ensure integration of efforts.
Approach	General approach or methods to be used to achieve purpose.	The Working Group will meet on the second Tuesday of every other month. The cochair(s) of the Working Group will attend the AZTech Executive Committee and AZTech Strategic Steering Committee meetings to update the group on activities and get input where needed and if there is funding or other resource needs, change in direction or focus. Working Teams will be formed to assist in the implementation of initiatives and may meet frequently in between Working Group meetings.
Tracking & Reporting	Project updates & communication of progress, milestones, timelines, etc. Include frequency of communications.	The AZTech TMC Operators Working Group Co-Chairs will report progress to the AZTech Strategic Steering Committee and Executive Committee at their meetings and internally as needed. Working Group to provide action plan initiatives and update the status of the initiatives in the Central Resource Database.
